SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS

Where are we this year in our spiritual journey as we once again hear these powerful readings about the coming of the Holy Spirit and the effects of the Spirit’s presence? In John’s Gospel account, we ponder Jesus’ intriguing name for a new presence he will send from the Father to the disciples: “the Advocate.” This Advocate will plead our cause and defend us. In addition, he will glorify Christ and testify about him, as well as guide the early Church in truth. As the Spirit witnesses and reveals everything to the disciples, so the disciples will also bear witness and reveal the Gospel. This assurance of the Spirit’s presence and their confirmation in truth must have been a comfort to John’s community in the days of persecution.

Taken together, the readings tell us that the Spirit directs our hearts to choose what is holy and “of God” rather than what is of “this world” or “the flesh.” May we open ourselves to the Spirit so that we can choose to use the Spirit’s gifts and give witness to the Christ and his call to salvation!

**LITURGY CORNER**

**Our “Liturgy Corner” takes a journey through the General Instruction of the Roman Missal**

Today we celebrate Pentecost, sometimes referred to as the “Birthday of the Church”! Last weekend, celebrating the Ascension of the Lord, Fr. McCarthy asked the First Communicants if Jesus was going to be with them as they left the church building. The kids were very cute as they nodded their heads. Then he turned to the rest of us and asked the same. Well, we weren’t quite as cute, but we also didn’t seem to be quite as sure. Do we know that Jesus comes to us in a special way in his Body and Blood AND that, though he ascended into heaven, he left us with this gift of Communion and with the gift of the Holy Spirit! Wow! Do we realize that Jesus is with us today? Do we realize we can grow closer by turning to him in prayer and by receiving his Body and Blood often?

We side step the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* today and reprint a part of the article included in the new newsletter. In the newsletter the writing credit is given to our Pat Campbell, but it is a handout prepared by Father Michael Balash and our Diocesan Office of Worship.

The Communion Procession is an action of the Body of Christ. At Christ’s invitation, extended by the priest acting in Christ’s person, we hear at Mass, *“Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.”* The members of the community move forward to share in the sacred meal, to receive the Body and Blood of Christ which is the sign and the source of their unity. In fact, each time we move forward together to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord, we join the countless ranks of all the baptized who have gone before us; our loved ones, the canonized and uncanonized saints down through the ages, who at their time in history formed a part of this mighty stream of believers.

This action by Christ’s body, the Church assembled for the Eucharist, is manifested and supported by the Communion Hymn, a hymn in praise of Christ sung by the united voices of those who believe in him and share his life.

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM) takes this hymn very seriously, mandating that it should begin at the Communion of the priest and extend until the last person has received Communion.

For some, however, the singing of this hymn is perceived as an intrusion on their own prayer, their private thanksgiving after Communion. In fact, however, this hymn is prayer, the corporate thanksgiving prayer of the members of Christ’s Body, united with one another. Over and over again the prayers of the liturgy and the norms of the GIRM emphasize this fundamental concept of the unity of the baptized, stressing that when we come together to participate in the Eucharistic celebration we come, not as individuals, but as united members of Christ’s body.

The last paragraph opens up the point made last week, this “new” way of looking at and experiencing the Communion procession and the quiet time following the procession.
