

PASTOR’S COLUMN

Scripture Insights

The First Reading tells the story of young Samuel who was serving in the Israelite sanctuary in Shiloh under the priest, Eli. During the night Samuel was sleeping in the temple when he heard someone call, “Samuel!!” He ran to Eli saying, “Here I am,” but Eli had not called him. Three times Samuel heard the voice, until Eli realized that God was calling his servant. He instructed Samuel to respond, “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.” From that time, we are told, God was with Samuel, making all of his words effective.

Today’s Gospel invites us to reflect on another calling -- that of Jesus’ disciples. In this call story it is John the Baptist who helps two of his own disciples recognize the Lord. When they go to Jesus, he initiates the encounter by asking, “What are you looking for?” -- a key question for any seeker. Their response -- “Where are you staying?” -- has profound implications. The Greek word *menein* means “to remain” or “to stay with,” and in John’s Gospel it also describes the divine dwelling within a person, like the relationship that Jesus has with the Father (see John 14: 9-11; 15: 4). The seeking and

finding theme is also important here. Like those who seek Lady Wisdom in the Old Testament books of Wisdom and Proverbs, those who seek Jesus will find him and become one with him as he is one with the Father.

Practice of Charity

What ordinary moments in your life repeatedly invite frustration? The drive to work? The mess left in the kitchen? Brainstorm ways to invite God into these moments. Notice what happens when you do!

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book by Goffredo Boselli ...
Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

*We reflect on "Mystagogy of the Presentation of the Gifts"
We have read the explanations of how the presentation
of the gifts at Mass is tied to our being at peace with our
brothers and sisters and the reality of the connection of
altar and the poor.*

Today we continue a description of what is presented.

*Wine drinkers among us may find Enzo Bianchi's
descriptions of wine-drinking particularly lovely.*

Wine, unlike bread, is not a principle of sustenance.
It is not on the order of necessity. Without wine, one can
certainly live. Enzo Bianchi has written:

Along with the bread we need, the daily bread that
dispels hunger and that is necessary for survival, we
have wine of gratuity and feast; a drink that is never
necessary simply to live, but which still is precious for
the consolation, the shared joy, and the friendship that
it helps to foster. <Il Pane di Ieri (Turin: Einaudi, 2008)>

Wine, then, is gratuity, joy, pleasure, and at times
also excess, the kind of excess which removes some
of the burden of the drudgery of daily living and calms
the heart... Certainly wine calls for caution and
responsibility, and there is an art to drinking it to the
point of gentle intoxication that frees one from the
composure that daily living demands without
succumbing to unrestrained drunkenness.

Wine is therefore a symbol of gratuity, expressing the
excess of human life. It is synonymous with feasting and
fullness of life. Because its context is joy, wine calls to
mind community, sharing, and social bonds. Both bread
and wine are synonymous with sharing, because the
human person does not eat and drink simply as the
animals do but shares with others that which brings life
and joy.
