People step away from the Church for many reasons. His interest in and welcome to Zaccaeus, Levi (later Matthew), the Syrophonecian mother, the Samaritan woman at the well, and other marginalized people in the Gospel accounts can be our example.

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book by Goffredo Boselli ... Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

Part Two of this book is entitled, "Liturgy in the Life of the Church." This section of Chapter Five, "The Sacrament of the Assembly," is entitled "God Enters into a Covenant with His People." Here is a taste from – pages 120 & 121...

Since the day of Pentecost, the work of the Holy Spirit has been to continue Christ's mission of gathering the dispersed children of God, giving life to the people of the new covenant. It is no coincidence that a theology of eucharistic assembly was reborn in the Catholic Church at the same time Catholic theology was rediscovering the close connection between the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist. The end and purpose to which the Christians are called in assembly is the body of Christ. The transformation of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ by the action of the Holy Spirit is not, in fact, an end in itself; rather, the gifts are transformed so that those who eat them may become what they receive. This is the dynamic of the two epicleses of the eucharistic prayer: one epiclesis over the gifts and the second over the communicants. For example, in the epiclesis over the communicants of Eucharistic Prayer II of the Roman Missal, the church prays:

Humbly we pray
that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ,
we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.

There are two bodies placed in relationship here: the eucharistic body and the ecclesial body. The former finds its goal in the latter. The proper end of the eucharistic body is to form the ecclesial body. In this dynamic, the Holy Spirit always continues gathering into one body the scattered children of God. The church cannot be satisfied with having the Eucharist; it does not possess it. The Eucharist serves no purpose if it remains simply an object to be possessed and adored. The church, however, is called to become the eucharistic body of the Lord; the truth of the eucharistic body is the ecclesial body.
