THE LORD IS RISEN,

Today the Church continues to celebrate and unfold the significance of the Risen Lord. Jesus' words to the disciples at the Last Supper take on more meaning now at Easter Time.

Previous texts from Acts described harmony in the community, but in today's account we see tension among the faithful. The community's solution, to appoint seven men to care for those being neglected, shows that the early Church was already prioritizing service. The new ministry of the seven, although composed of specially chosen individuals, is seen as a model for all believers.

The first verse of today's psalm suggests that it was a hymn of praise sung during the liturgy to the accompaniment of instruments. The following two verses and the refrain make it clear why the Lord is worthy of this praise.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

In the Second Reading, the image of the community as "living stones" forming themselves into a "spiritual house" fits perfectly with the two verses about cornerstones quoted from Isaiah 28 and Psalm 118. For early Christian authors, Christ was the cornerstone around which the faithful built themselves. For those without faith, however, the Christ/cornerstone would become a stumbling stone.

Today's Gospel ties together the themes from the other readings. If there was a sense of division in the community in the First Reading, it is replaced by the unity that will mark the gathering of Jesus and His disciples in the Kingdom of Heaven. The spiritual building that disciples make of themselves on earth will become a heavenly dwelling place where there will be room for all. This, Jesus promises, will happen when He returns to the Father. The assurance that He gives the disciples at His impending departure also brings comfort and hope to us all.

The Spiritual Meaning of the Liturgy

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book by Goffredo Boselli
Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

This book is a treasure of information and reflection, as its first chapters discuss mystagogy through different parts of the Mass. Continuing to speak about the parts of the Mass, the author describes the Introductory Rites in a way that may help us to begin to see the bigger plan of the ritual we celebrate each week.

The four elements of the eucharistic celebration that make up the introductory rite — the greeting, the penitential act, the doxology, and the collect — cannot be understood in isolation from each other. Rather, they reproduce a precise scriptural dynamic that becomes a liturgical dynamic: presence, mercy, glory.

The purpose of the introductory rites is to bring the assembly into the presence of the Lord. Thus, the first authentically liturgical act that the assembly is called to carry out is to approach God's presence.

Do we realize that we are entering into God's presence as we begin the celebration of the liturgy?

THE IMPORTANCE OF PARISH LEADERS

What is a Parish Leader? Why do we need them?

A Parish Leader is a professional minister appointed by the bishop with the responsibility of leading a parish community that does not have a resident priest. A priest will be assigned as canonical pastor and for sacramental celebrations at the parish.

In response to the Pastoral Plan for Evangelization, the Diocese of Youngstown is training 14 individuals (deacons, religious, and laity) who will be available to serve as Parish Leaders. This is one way the diocese is addressing the reality of fewer priests. It is an opportunity for faith-filled men and women to use their gifts of leadership and administration, allowing priests to focus on the sacramental and pastoral care of the faithful.
