TO BE COMMISSIONED TO CONTINUE YOUR MINISTRY

We will call forward all those to be entrusted with administering the Eucharist, with taking Communion to the sick, and with giving it as viaticum to the dying. The Church reminds us that "Sacramental Communion received during Mass is a more complete participation in the Eucharistic celebration." For some in our parish community, it is not possible to join the community at Mass. We are told, "In fact it is proper that those who are prevented from being present at the community's celebration should be refreshed with the Eucharist." In this way, they may realize that they are united not only with the Lord's sacrifice but also with the community itself and are supported by the love of their brothers and sisters.

Here in our parish there are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who are trained to assist the Priest and Deacon with the distribution of Holy Communion during the Mass, and there are Ministers of Care who are specially trained to take Communion to those who are in hospitals, nursing homes and to those who are homebound. On our parish feast day, we ask God to bless our brothers and sisters who have declared their willingness to serve the Church in this way. Please come forward for your blessing!

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book by Goffredo Boselli
Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

This book is a treasure of information and reflection, as its first chapters discuss mystagogy through different parts of the Mass. Continuing to speak about the parts of the Mass, the author describes the Introductory Rites in a way that may help us to begin to see the bigger plan of the ritual we celebrate each week.

Since you have taken the time to read this, perhaps you, too, are looking for ways to get more out of the celebration of the Liturgy by understanding more if the “why do we do that?” Today the author moves ahead to the singing of the Gloria... and here are a couple of “whys.” Having been forgiven of its sins, the assembly is then worthy to offer its praise to God by singing the Gloria. This sequence – invocation of God’s mercy and proclamation of God’s glory — expresses a fundament biblical truth regarding the relationship between the mercy and the glory of God.

Made pure by the mercy of God, the liturgical assembly is worthy to worship, and by singing the Gloria it expresses its intention to carry out the act or worship in its totality, evoking the five fundamental cultic verbs of the Bible:

**“We praise you, we bless you, we adore you,
we glorify you, we give you thanks
for your great glory.”**

We have taken a glance at the Introductory rites for several columns and we have to wait until next week for the Collect – which ends the introductory rite.

In other words, all of this happens on Sunday in less than seven minutes! Perhaps having a better understanding of all that is involved in the celebration of the Eucharist can help us to see why we need to be present for this first part of the Mass. It isn’t the proclamation of God’s Word, nor is it the reception of Christ in Communion, but it is what prepares us for all that takes place within Mass and fills us with what we need to take Christ to the world!

CECILIA PROJECT

The Cecilia Project was developed in 2014 in response to the Priest Council to encourage, recruit and train qualified people to become pastoral musicians in our parishes and institutions. The Music Committee of Diocesan Liturgical Commission, in conjunction with the Office of Worship, created the Cecilia Project to meet this need, by providing a competent training program and experience for potential musicians to become music ministers in our parishes.

Approximately 15 participants have been involved, engaging in various liturgical formation opportunities, and music lessons in the area of interest. Some are now preparing for NPM certification, and upon completion will be offered an internship opportunity in our parishes.

A second group of prospective participants is now being formed for September 2017. Interest forms are available, and should be returned by August 1. Interested candidates will be invited to an organizational gathering and picnic in August.
