If you wish to have a child baptized in the next few months please call the parish office to register.

Baptismal preparation sessions are scheduled 6 times/year (Jan-Mar-May-Jul-Sep-Nov) and parents need to attend a session before scheduling the baptism. Godparents are to help the parents as they raise their child in the Catholic faith, so godparents are to be Catholic, and there is to be one male and one female godparent. *Families need to be registered members of the parish. It is our hope that they regularly participate at mass, considering themselves to be members of the parish community.* Baptisms are normally celebrated on the fourth weekend of the month. Parents are to attend a baptismal session prior to their child’s baptism. The preparation session offers an opportunity to discuss the sacrament of baptism in the life of this child. It is not simply a “rehearsal” of the rite itself.

## THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

**Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book**

by **Goffredo Boselli** ... Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

*Today we offer a look at one last part of the Penitential Act and this is in relation to the "absolution" offered to conclude the Penitential Act.*

*Today's quotes come from a section entitled*

*"Sacramental Efficacy." Boselli writes:*

"Although called 'absolution,' the blessing that concludes the Penitential Act – the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM, 51)* explains — 'lacks the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance.'

The meaning of this clarification is understood fully if it is interpreted in the light of the apostle Paul's exhortation to the Christians of Corinth on the necessity to receive the body of Christ worthily: (*1 Cor 11: 27 – 29*)

For Paul, communion in the bread and the chalice of the Lord requires a prior discernment of the quality of one's relationship with God and with one's brothers and sisters, that is, of whether the act of sacramental communion is contradicted by a grave situation of existential noncommunion with God and with the church.

What meaning would there be for someone who is, in daily living, separated from God and from his brothers and sisters in faith (thus demonstrating a failure to discern the body of the Lord) to nourish himself on that bread that "makes admonishment,

which has become for the church the criterion for participation at the eucharistic table."

*We are to be prepared to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. We are to examine our lives and be able to recognize, despite how we may come up short, we have made efforts to live as a follower of Christ each day.*

"May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life."
