The Wonder of a Warm Welcome

How I love visitors -- when they are friends or family I know and enjoy! The company of compatriots who affirm and support, comfort and sustain, even tease and tantalize me is a pleasurable gift. I race around the house getting things ready, making meals that are easy to serve, do not demand last-minute preparation, and will withstand delays. Scrumptious smells fill the kitchen and special desserts crowd the freezer. Excitement mounts as anticipation increases. Oh, how true are the words of Christ, "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me."

There is wonder in a warm welcome!

...But when I do not know the folks or feel pressured by a change in scheduling or errant timing, there is a whole different feeling going on. Anxiety replaces anticipation and exhaustion depletes exhilaration. My welcoming spirit has been supplanted by thinly disguised resentment. Duty displaces desire as I am

being baptized into a death I did not seek. All the careful planning turns into details that bury me in busyness. Without conscious effort on my part, anointing grace becomes an annoying grind. Is this what losing my life for God's sake is all about?

What is wrong?

When I look at myself and my attitude, a clear picture emerges. I love me, my choice of companions, my routine, my time frame, more than the Jesus who comes to me inconveniently, at a moment I did not select, in the form and shape of someone I do not really know. Having sought only myself, I am discovering ruin. I am learning a terrifying truth. I do not wish to take up that cross and follow an indefatigable Jesus whose mission knew no respite!

The wonder of a warm welcome is wearisome.

...However, those unlikely, unwelcome ones are the very people who empower our discipleship. They are the catalysts for our entry into nothingness for the sake of Christ. They effect our self-discovery and promote continuing transformation.

...I am the lowly one who is in need of a cup of

Baptismal preparation sessions are scheduled 6 times/year (Jan-Mar-May-Jul-Sep-Nov) and parents need to attend a session before scheduling the Baptism. Godparents are to help the parents as they raise their child in the Catholic faith, so godparents are to be Catholic, and there is to be one male and one female godparent. *Families need to be registered members of the parish. It is our hope that they regularly participate at Mass, considering themselves to be members of the parish community.* Baptisms are normally celebrated on the fourth weekend of the month. Parents are to attend a Baptismal session prior to their child's Baptism. The preparation session offers an opportunity to discuss the Sacrament of Baptism in the life of this child. It is not simply a "rehearsal" of the rite itself.

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book

Last week's column mentioned "Sacramental Efficacy" and talked about the words of absolution offered by the priest at the conclusion of the Penitential Act.

Some have grabbed hold of that and asked, "Why say it if it isn't meaningful?" Aha! The author continued to look at the sins we commit, and at the way the Father's of the church viewed the sacrament of penance and the absolution offered at the conclusion of the Penitential Act.

This should help to unpack this for us...

"Summing up, it is completely incorrect to deny all sacramental value to the prayer of absolution recited at the end of the penitential act, since every formula and gesture of the liturgy possesses a sacramental quality. Indeed, to suggest that the words of forgiveness spoken by the priest do not effect what they signify, being merely a simple greeting or formality, would gravely contradict the meaning of the liturgy and the value of the words spoken within it.

By specifying instead that the absolution "lacks the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance," the GIRM demonstrates both liturgical insight and pastoral wisdom while remaining in continuity with the great tradition of the church to which the patristic texts cited above attest (*the words of the leaders of the early Church*).

The GIRM does not affirm that the absolution of the penitential act lacks sacramental efficacy but that it "lacks the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance." The absolution enjoys a different level of efficacy, certainly inferior to the sacrament of penance.

What? Well, we need both the absolution we receive at Mass – to help us with our preparation to worthily receive Christ's Body and Blood – AND we know that for forgiveness of "great sin" is necessary to receive the Sacrament of Penance, affirming the need we have for a period of conversion and penance in which the believer is helped by a spiritual guide (the priest) to become aware of his existential situation.

Even taking a few minutes to ponder the meaning of the Penitential Act and how it impacts my life helps me.

There is so much more to the celebration of the Mass and, by entering into it with more awareness and by taking time to reflect on the experience (mystagogy) in my life after the celebration, it (Mass) can help me as I try to grow closer to Christ!
