

## PASTOR'S COLUMN

Wednesday July 26 marked the feast day of St. Joachim and St. Anne, parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus. Our parents and grandparents are key in our upbringing, the shaping of who we grow to be. The love they share, the investment of time and commitment, cannot be understated, and taking some time to reflect on their influence is very important.

I share this meditation with you which provides just a few of the wonderful qualities of God, our Heavenly Father, and qualities that I have witnessed in my parents, too. From The Word Among Us on the Feast of Anne and Joachim:

A gift can reveal a lot about the character of the one giving it. Think, for instance, of the grandmother who picks out the "perfect" birthday gift for you. The gift is wonderful, but even better is the effort your grandmother put into finding it.

Manna, the miracle bread God gave the Israelites during their years in the desert, can tell us a lot about him

too. It tells us that . . .

- *God is faithful.* He provided the manna every morning for the entire forty years the Israelites were in the desert. Each night when they went to bed, they could trust that fresh manna would appear again in the morning. God never tired or missed a day. He never failed to provide for them.
- *God is generous.* He fed the Israelites even when they were complaining. He fed them even after they had turned from Him and worshipped the golden calf. He didn't withdraw from them. He graciously gave them the food they needed regardless of whether they were grateful, even regardless of whether they had obeyed Him.
- *God is present in everyday things.* He sent the manna with the morning dew; it didn't look like anything special. Scripture tells us that it looked "like coriander seed" (Numbers 11: 7). Whatever it was, God used what looked like ordinary matter to provide for

**The Transfiguration (August 6)**

*LITURGICAL GUIDE*

*From Adolf Adam’s The Key to Faith: Meditations on the Liturgical Year*

We find a festival dedicated to the transfiguration for the first time in the East Syrian Church in the fifth century, from which it was picked up by the other Eastern churches. In the West we encounter it for the first time in the tenth century in the Frankish-Roman Church. During the period of the crusades it quickly spread to other regions. However, it was not until 1457 that Pope Callixtus III introduced it for the entire Church. The historical occasion for this was gratitude for the previous year’s victory over the Turks, by whom the West was severely threatened.

Naturally Christ’s transfiguration stands at the center of the Mass for this day. The Gospel pericope <a selection from a book, especially a passage from the Bible read at religious services> is taken from one of the three synoptic gospels, corresponding to the yearly cycle <for us, this year, Matthew 17: 1-9>. The mystery of this feast also echoes in the opening and alleluia verses, as well as in the second reading from the second letter of Peter (2 Pt 1: 16–19). The first reading (Dan 7: 9–10, 13–14) present us with the vision of the “Ancient One” seated upon a fiery throne, and the appearance of “one like a son of man,” to whom will be given dominion over the world; this vision is also reflected on in the responsorial psalm (verses from Psalm 97). The special Preface celebrates the significance of Christ’s transfiguration in that it gives the disciples the power to carry their crosses and bestows upon them the hope of eternal transfiguration. The prayers for the eucharistic celebration ask that we may share in Christ’s glory.

For the spiritual reflection and meditation, the reader is referred to the Second Sunday of Lent, whose Gospel is also that of the transfiguration.

His people each and every day.

Just as the Israelites received manna from heaven, we receive the Eucharist, the "true bread from heaven" (John 6: 32). If manna can teach us about who God is, how much more can the Eucharist, which is God's gift of Himself, reveal to us?

In prayer today, consider what the Eucharist shows you about your heavenly Father: He is humble; He makes Himself present under the forms of "everyday" bread and wine, without fanfare. He is faithful; He offers Himself to you each day at Mass. He is generous; He gives you heavenly food, not as a reward for something you have done, but because He loves you and wants to sustain you.

Be thankful each day for your faith, and allow your thankfulness to transform you, to go out and share your love with others. Reflecting on these qualities of God, be thankful for the guidance you have received in developing your faith, from your parents and grandparents, from teachers, from sponsors and mentors. Be thankful, and share your faith!

## THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

**Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book**

by Goffredo Boselli ... Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, ©2014

Today we reflect on "Mystagogy of the Liturgy of the Word"

*In continuing our reflection on the "Mystagogy of the Liturgy of the Word," the author spends several pages unfolding the circumstances surrounding Luke 4: 16 – 28. He also looks at the "assembly of Ezra," as "narrated in Nehemiah 8: 1 - 12.*

*With this look at how the readings were proclaimed offers an opportunity to reflect on our own Liturgy of the Word.*

More eloquent than any discourse, in this regard, is the liturgical norm that is still in force today in the synagogue worship (and analogously in Christian worship), according to which the scroll of the Law cannot be taken from the ark (*aron*) and read if there are not present at least ten adult men (*minjan*).

This norm suggests above all that it is not enough for the book of the Law to be present and that someone reads from it; also necessary is people to hear it proclaimed.

This is the essential and decisive difference between the personal study of biblical texts and the liturgical proclamation of the Scriptures.

There can be no direct and individual relationship with the Scriptures, for between the book and the individual listener there is the ...liturgical community of believers (*ekklesia*).

The book, the one who reads it, and the one who hears it must each always be understood within the context of the *ekklesia*.

Hearing the Scripture happens fully and authentically only within the church, because that is where the Scriptures were born.

There are not Scriptures and also tradition; there is only the Scriptures within tradition.

In Jesuits Telling Jokes, Nikolaas Sintobin, SJ, uses a little Jesuit jocularity to introduce us to the Society of Jesus -- how they began, who they are, what they do. Each chapter opens with a humorous cartoon and joke to illuminate one particular aspect of the Jesuits, and the rest of the chapter offers a brief but insightful look into a foundational Ignatian principle or practice, such as the discernment of spirits, finding freedom in obedience, and making the street a monastery.
