Practice of Faith

Faith prompts us to share what we’ve been given with others, through direct teaching, or simply as a companion on the path. Adults have a special obligation to assist teens, whose world is full of challenges and perils.

- ◇ St. John Bosco (1815-1888) had a genius for teaching the young, inspired by an early insight: “Not with blows, but with charity and gentleness must you draw these friends to the path of virtue.” Find out more about this inspiring educator and the Salesian Society he founded: newadvent.org/cathen/02689d.htm.
- ◇ Consider becoming a catechist at your parish. You may be able to start as an assistant teacher and gain experience until it’s time to lead a class.
- ◇ Film is a powerful way to catechize, or simply to spark a conversation about faith with young people. Find out how film series at a Catholic University (“Bringing Eyes of Faith to Film”) has helped develop students’ sacramental imagination and improve their media literacy: files.eric.ed.gov/fulltext/EJ938855.pdf. If you wish to have a child baptized in the next few months and have not yet registered for baptismal preparation, please call the parish office to let us know you plan to attend the September session. If you are expecting a child, why not attend before your child arrives and get another thing “out of the way?” Baptismal preparation sessions are scheduled 6 times a year (Jan-Mar-May-Jul-Sep-Nov); parents need to attend a session before scheduling the baptism. THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book

We continue to reflect on “Mystagogy of the Liturgy of the Word”

Today’s reflection delves more deeply into the relationship between the Scriptures and liturgy. We share part of “Evangelarium and Altar, “Word of the Cross” and Eucharist,” pages 64 -65...

By placing the Evangelarium <Book of the Gospels> at the center of the altar at the beginning of the liturgy, when the altar is free of any other object, the church recognizes in the Book of the Gospels the same dignity possessed by the Eucharistic gifts.

On the altar, the Evangelarium has the place of the Eucharist. It is not only an object used *in* worship. It is an object *of* worship. Placing the Evangelarium on the altar is a liturgical act that expresses an intensely theological idea taught by the Second Vatican Council:

The Christian is nourished by “the bread of life...from the one table of the Word of God and the Body of Christ.”

We should recall that in the Eastern churches, the Book of the Gospel is enthroned on the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations.

What mystery of faith is expressed in the act of taking the Evangelarium from the altar? Just as the Eucharistic bread and wine are taken from the altar so that the faithful may nourish themselves on the body of Christ, so also the Gospel is taken from the altar so that the faithful may be nourished with the word of Christ.

There are very few parts of the liturgy that do not carry deeper meanings that we might be missing!

**THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS --
EVENING PRAYER AT BSPCC**

In the *Apostolic Constitution of The Divine Office (Laudis Canticum)* Pope Paul VI said this in reference to the praying of the Liturgy of the Hours:

Christian prayer above all is the prayer of the whole human community, which Christ joins to himself. Everyone shares in this prayer, which is proper to the one Body, as it offers prayers that give expression to the voice of Christ's beloved Bride, to the hopes and desires of the whole Christian people, and to supplications and petitions for the needs of all humanity.

Why pray Evening Prayer? No requirement is met -- except the call to "pray constantly." The General Instruction of the Liturgy of the Hours, paragraph 11 states, ... "The purpose of the Liturgy of the Hours is to sanctify the day and the whole range of human activity."

Last week we shared the idea that liturgy transforms and that, by praying the Liturgy of the Hours, we can be transformed...

Our liturgical rituals challenge us to live the Paschal Mystery, to open our lives to that rhythm of dying to self and rising in Christ. It is impossible to grasp the depth of that mystery in a single celebration, liturgical season or cycle. The transformation we long for is accomplished gradually, through the daily, weekly, and yearly rhythm of celebrations that draw us ever deeper into the Mystery of all mysteries. Time becomes our entry point into the Paschal Mystery.
