

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Scripture Insights

Today's readings challenge us to think in new and deeper ways about justice and mercy. The First Reading speaks to us about vengeance and concludes with a wise teaching about the consequences of hard-heartedness and double-dealing. Two points are made. The revenge you seek will come down on yourself. You cannot expect God to be merciful to you if you are not merciful to others.

In the Second Reading, Paul tells his readers that they must be compassionate when dealing with fellow believers whose opinions differ from their own. Far more important than our opinions is that in life or death, we belong to the Lord.

The Gospel contains a powerful though perhaps unsettling parable about vengeance and mercy. First, Peter asks, "How often must I forgive?" In biblical times, seven and multiples of seven were understood to symbolize fullness or completion. Thus Jesus' answer amounts to something like, "When you've forgiven someone as many times as possible, keep going!" The parable that follows is about a king who forgave an enormous debt owed by one of his servants and then changed his mind when he discovered that the servant was not, in turn, extending mercy. Justice and mercy are more closely intertwined that we might think!

Last month, we heard and read reports of hate groups acting out publically, resulting in the loss of life. How we respond to these uprisings -- in words and actions -- speaks volumes to our families and communities about who we are as Christians. I am reminded of Jesus' calm responses when challenges were posed to Him during His public ministry, and admit I am not so well prepared, as He was. His line of defense was The Word.

I am grateful to everyone who was moved to provide support for Catholic Charities USA in assisting families and communities after storms ravaged our southern states. I am grateful to those who were moved to serve as mentors when Sr. Patricia expressed the need to continue to help women with new Beatitude House programming. I am grateful to you as you continue your participation in ministry in our parish community. Thank you for responding with an open heart. Please continue to share your gifts for the benefit of others.

Early in September, the Diocesan priests gathered for a convocation in Pittsburgh. Since we met as a group two years ago, 18 priests have died. This reality was shocking to us. A number of priests will retire in the coming years, or retire due to poor health. Our diocese will face many challenges in the coming days. How will you respond?

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book

We continue to reflect on "Mystagogy of the Liturgy of the Word"

Today's reflection speaks more about the connection between the cross and the gospel. We share part of "Evangelarium and Altar, "Word of the Cross" and Eucharist," pages 66-67.

(Evangelarium is the Book of the Gospels.)

That the gospel and the cross are inseparable is attested also by the small sign of the cross that the one who proclaims the gospel traces on the page of the *Evangelarium*, a gesture that he then repeats together with the faithful on his forehead, his lips, and his chest, signifying their openness to the Word of the gospel in their most basic faculties: intellect, speech and will.

A memorial of the baptismal *sphragis*, this gesture represents a cruciform incision of the *verbum crucis* on the forehead, the place of one's mind and intelligence; on the lips, the place of one's voice and the words one speaks; and on the heart, the place of one's will and emotions.

The meaning of this sign of the cross traced first by the deacon on the gospel page and then by all the faithful three times on themselves brings William Durandus to call the *Evangelarium* the *liber Crucifixi*:

"This is the book or the Gospel of God. This is the book of the Crucified One [*liber Crucifixi*] that I preach. This is the book of the man of peace from whom we have received reconciliation, as the Apostle says:

"We preach Christ crucified."

This reflection offers a chance to look at the three small crosses we make each week as we respond to the priest or deacon, "Glory to you, O Lord."
