## Flu Season and Liturgical Celebrations

During flu season, parishes may receive requests from parishioners to make changes to liturgical celebrations in order to prevent the spread of the flu and other viruses. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, in consultation with the Center for Disease Control, recommends that the following measures be taken in the celebration of the liturgy:

Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should be especially reminded of the need to practice good hygiene. All Ministers of Holy Communion are encouraged to wash their hands using an alcohol based anti-bacterial solution before Mass begins and immediately after Mass.

Pastors should instruct people who feel ill not to receive from the cup.

Those who are sick should stay home, and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.

All should be encouraged to follow good everyday healthy actions:

- of covering your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing;
- avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth after shaking hands or touching any surface;
- avoid close contact with those who are sick.

**At the present time, the Bishop's Committee on Divine Worship of USCCB has not issued directives considering any changes, adaptations or restrictions of options in the celebration of the Liturgy.**

## THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE LITURGY

**Words of Wisdom to Ponder from the Book**

*We begin to reflect on "Mystagogy of the Presentation of the Gifts"*

Referring to the liturgy's presentation of the gifts, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)* observes realistically, "Even though the faithful no longer bring from their own possessions the bread and wine intended for the liturgy as was once the case, nevertheless the rite of carrying up the offerings still keeps its spiritual efficacy and significance."

...The spiritual meaning of bringing the bread and wine to the altar remains intact. My intent here, therefore, will be to draw out the *vis* and the *signification spiritualis* – the efficacy, the power, and the spiritual meaning of this rite.

Since the Eucharist is, as we believe, the source of Christian ethics, I would like to reflect on the rite of the presentation of the gifts, first of all, as a model and paradigm of such ethics. Inasmuch as it is a eucharistic ethic, it is one of communion with God and of sharing with others, particularly the poor who lack both bread and dignity. The purpose of this chapter is essentially to provide an answer to a single question: *What vision of Christian community, of human community, and therefore of society and the world, emerges from the rite of the presentation of the gifts?*

*Hang on! There is challenge to come!*
