**Meditations**

excerpts from *The Word Among Us* 11/22/2016

What do you remember most fondly about your home when you were growing up? Maybe sitting around the dinner table, laughing with your family. Or perhaps the backyard, where you climbed trees in the summer. No matter how old we get, our childhood homes hold a special place in our hearts.

(In today's Gospel), we hear about another home, the Temple in Jerusalem. "Adorned with costly stones," it was beloved, down to the last detail, by the Jewish people (Lk 21:5).

The Jewish people expected the Messiah to protect the Temple, not predict its destruction. ... That temple is the Church, and he is the cornerstone. The rest of the building is made out of living stones -- us.

Because we are a living temple in Christ, how we live makes a difference... we add beauty and strength to the whole Church when we show patience to one of our children... our few minutes of reflection on the Scriptures daily not only enliven our relationship with God but draw all of us closer to Jesus.

God always has more -- more that he wants to see done in the Church and more grace for us to accomplish his work. So today, ask: "What one small thing can I do to build up your Church, Lord?" Listen to what the Holy Spirit says: it could be something small, but even so, it will delight the Lord and bless

his people.

Recently I had the privilege of being in company with faith leaders of the Mahoning Valley Association of Churches, and civic leaders from our Valley. We shared prayer time together, and shared a meal, and there was more prayer in song, celebrating our conviction that we are all one! What an honor to have had this experience as we move into the Season of Advent. Rather than focus on our differences -- faith, race, political association, socio-economic status, the region of the Valley we live and serve in, or even our meal preferences -- we celebrated the powerful light of God shining brightly on us! God's light provided us with clear focus on the work we need to do in uniting our faiths and resources to His end, not our own. Congressman Tim Ryan was the featured speaker that morning. He led us in a time of quiet reflection, where we shut out the noise of our selves, and of our environment ...to come to a place of refreshment, renewed energy. He showed us how this very healthy practice renews us physically, mentally, and emotionally. I immediately found it helpful in this Season of Advent, and a perfect preparation prior to reconciliation.

Join me in this holy season in bringing -- and being -- the light of Christ to one another...in a spirit of welcoming, a spirit of forgiveness, a spirit of compassion and brotherly love...as we pray our way through Advent to the day of Christmas.

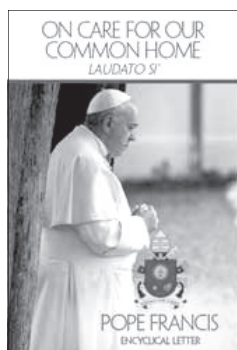
