

Make This Lent All It Can Be

Kevin Cotter offered suggestions about what to do for Lent last year (February 22, 2017) as he took what he saw as the “Top Ten” of Pope Francis’ tips when asked “What should I do for Lent?” At www.focusoncampus.org he offered these as his “Top Ten”:

- 1) Get rid of the lazy addiction to evil (self-denial hurts)
- 2) Do something that hurts (self-denial to help others)
- 3) Do not remain indifferent (see neighbor’s struggles)
- 4) Pray: Make our hearts like yours (generous heart)
- 5) Take part in the sacraments (become more like Him)
- 6) Prayer (dive into the endless sea of God’s mercy)
- 7) Fasting (makes sense if it questions our security)
- 8) Almsgiving (lose the obsession with possession)
- 9) Help the poor (the way to love & serve Christ)
- 10) Evangelize (Be joyous heralds of His message)

This presentation has become a regular part of how we prepare for the celebration of the center of the Church year – the Triduum (The Three Days).


